

## What Is Your Christian Duty?

#### To Bishops, Pastors, and Preachers

The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are **worthy of double honor**, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching. For the Scripture says, "Do not muzzle the ox while it is treading out the grain," and "The worker deserves his wages." 1 Timothy 5:17-18.

We ask you, brothers, to respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the **highest regard in love** because of their work. **Live in peace** with each other. 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13

**Obey your leaders** and submit to their authority. They keep watch over you as men who must give an account. Obey them so that **their work will be a joy**, not a burden, for that would be of no advantage to you. Hebrews 13:17

justice we've accomplished this year with a **special meal** hosted by Trinity Christian Fellowship Center (1925 Northgate Blvd., Srq 34234). Network Members bring your check book and invest your \$200 or more!

"He has shown you, oh mortal, what is good and what does the Lord require of you? But to **do justice**, love mercy, and walk humbly with your God" (Micah 6:8).

What is justice? Loving our neighbor, widows and orphans on a scale far beyond individuals or the family. Unlike mercy ministry that treats people in a time of crisis (food, tutoring, shelter), **justice** calls for **transforming of systems** (education, criminal justice, etc.) to be fair and just for all.

SURE unites people of faith in Sarasota County so that they can powerfully **hold systems accountable** in the community to a Godly standard of justice. For over a decade, SURE has been a definitive force in Sarasota, crossing lines of faith, denomination, age, race, geography, and income. Members of SURE's **16 congregations, including Concordia**, work hard to 1) build relationships in their congregations and their communities, 2) discuss their concerns for the city and county, 3) research solutions to serious problems they select, 4) present them to the proper officials and 5) work with them to make "sure" our community is a just one.

In 2017 SURE launches a new initiative to increase Sarasota's affordable housing. **What can SURE do?** 

In 2016 SURE secured \$2.25 million over the next three years for a **Comprehensive Treatment** 

**Court** that will help **homeless people with mental illness** get into 6 months of housing and wrap around services. This court will keep them out of the expensive jail cycle that traps so many homeless individuals. This court will benefit 120 people per year, and the taxpayers.

In early 2015 SURE got the local stakeholders - the State Attorney, Public Defender, and Chief Judge - to support the implementation of Civil Citation in Sarasota for the first time ever. In the fall of 2015 the Sheriff implemented Civil Citation. Since then, youth arrests have dropped by 66%. Keeping kids out of the juvenile justice system breaks the cycle of poverty, results in a lower crime rate, and keeps kids' futures intact.

SURE got the Sarasota **School Superintendent** to adopt a **restorative justice program** to **reduce suspensions** in all county schools by 2019. Keeping kids in school means a better educated workforce, less kids going into adulthood with arrest records, less crime on the streets, children learning how to resolve problems, and less burden on the family.

**Local author and historian** Jeff LaHurd has lived in Sarasota since 1950 and has written 12 books about the history of the community plus numerous articles which have appeared in The Sarasota Herald-Tribune, Style Magazine, The Sarasota Observer, SARASOTA Magazine, SRQ, and the Downtowner.

**His books** include: Quintessential Sarasota; Sarasota, A Sentimental Journey in Vintage Images; Gulf Coast Chronicles; Sarasota, Then and Now; The Lido Casino, Lost Treasure on the Beach; Sprint Training in Sarasota; Sarasota, A History, Roaring Through the 20's and his most recent book **Lost Histories of Sarasota** published by the History Press.

A video he wrote, Sarasota: Landmarks of the Past won the award for Outstanding Contribution to Preservation in the field of Communication from the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation and was shown on the History Channel.

He attended St. Martha's School, Cardinal Mooney High and graduated from Sarasota High School in 1964. He attended college at Manatee Jr. College and the University of South Florida where he received a BA in **history** and an MA in **counseling**.

Jeff is a former board member of the Sarasota Alliance for Historic Preservation, the Sarasota Historical Society, the Sarasota Community Blood Bank and the Downtown Kiwanis Club. He is currently a member of the Friends of Sarasota County History Center. He and his wife Jennifer have four children. He is employed by Sarasota County as a **History Specialist**.

His **hobbies** include following Grand Prix racing and praying annually for the

Cleveland Browns to produce a winning team. The prayers are seldom answered. He and Jennifer love to travel, especially to Paris where they try to go annually. Jeff drives a blue 1974 Triumph TR6 that starts practically every time but keeps a AAA-Plus card on hand just in case.
