Daily Prayers – How the head of the family should teach his household to pray morning and evening.

Morning Prayer

In the morning when you get up, make the **sign of the holy cross** and say:

In the name of the Father and of the Son

and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then, kneeling or standing, repeat the Creed and the Lord's Prayer. If you choose, you may

also say this little prayer:

I thank you, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would **keep me this day** also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For **into Your hands** I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Then **go joyfully** to your work, singing a hymn, like that of the Ten Commandments, or

whatever your devotion may suggest.

Evening Prayer

In the evening when you go to bed, make the sign of the holy cross and say:

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Then kneeling or standing, repeat the **Creed** and the Lord's Prayer. If you choose, you may also say this little prayer:

I thank you, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would **forgive me all** my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands, I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Then go to sleep at once and in **good** cheer.

Concordia Council Minutes Tuesday, August 8, 2023

Members in attendance: President-Dennis Jesse, Vice President-Phyllis Kirtley, Secretary-Ruth Bogenberger, Financial Secretary-Wayne Ulbrich, Worship-Alice Williams, Outreach-Dawn Mowery, Service-Margo Arehart, Education-Julie Smith, Properties-Dave Meadows, and Pastor Stephen Gaulke.

Members not present: Treasurer-Tom Mann

Guests present: None

Constitutional quorum in person

The meeting was called to order by Phyllis Kirtley at 6:02 P.M.

Opening Devotion: Romans 10:11-16 was read and discussed.

Phyllis Kirtley told the Council that a request had been made of the Foundation to donate \$600 to Pregnancy Solutions in Venice for a new computer. Dennis Jesse made a motion which Dawn Mowery seconded. The motion failed to pass by a margin of 3 yeas, 5 nays and 2 abstentions. (Pastor Stephen's note: Our Foundation's charter suggests "Lutheran charities." This very worthy pro-life ministry does not identify as "Lutheran.")

Upon a motion made by Dennis Jesse and seconded by Phyllis Kirtley, the Council unanimously approved reimbursing Pastor Ted Wuerffel for travel expenses of gas and lodging.

Vice President's Report: Phyllis Kirtley had nothing to report.

Secretary's Report: May's minutes were unanimously approved.

Financial Secretary's Report: Wayne Ulbrich said that deposits are being done successfully and timely. Wayne referred the Council to published reports which say attendance is up 2% year to date and offerings are up 19% for the same period.

Worship Report: Alice Williams reported that the elders are serving 24 homebound members. She told the Council that church elders agreed to use the government rate of employee compensation for Concordia's paid workers. Alice made a motion which was seconded by Barbara Briggs to compensate Rev. Ted Wuerffel as follows: Weekend preaching compensation to be taken from the guest preacher fund. Weekday pay will be taken from undedicated memorials. The motion passed unanimously.

Education Report: Julie Smith said that family nights are suspended for the summer.

Outreach Report: Dawn Mowery said that the Bread Breakers dinner on August 1st was successful. There are flyers in the Narthex to invite new members to future dinners. A few existing members dine with new members during these meals. Dawn mentioned that Junne Ulbrich is overseeing the craft fair for the November 4th Harvest Festival. Dawn asked for a volunteer to manage the festival portion of the event. Dawn said that only 90 tickets are available for the Octoberfest.

Service Report: Margo Arehart said that Concordia's LWML (Lutheran Women's

Fellowship Report: Barbara Briggs had nothing to add.

Council Minutes continued

Properties Report: Dave Meadows said that we are a few weeks away from finishing the ADA bathroom. (Some worker injuries have caused the delay.) Dave stated that a new air conditioning unit has been installed for the classrooms. Parsonage updates are as follows: A new clothes dryer has been purchased for \$400. Additionally, a fence will be installed 6 feet from the building to deter children on the playground from knocking on the parsonage windows.

President's Report: Dennis Jesse worked with Tom Mann and presented a recap of envelope giving. Dennis mentioned that the consolidation of dedicated funds is nearly complete and will be presented to the Council at a special meeting on September 12th. Dennis introduced some items to be included in employee reviews. He asked the Council members for their input. I am very happy to share with you some details about my life in **Saint Louis**, Missouri during this summer 2023. Often I am the **liturgist** at Timothy Lutheran Church, where are **Rev. Ted and Mrs. Abby Wuerffel** (**photo**) as members. I like to lead the **Bible study** also with 10 or 15 people. I lead that study once a month as part of my "Resident Field Education." I

thank God, the heavenly Father because He has given us various "offices" (roles and responsibilities) in our lives. I ask Him to grant us faithfulness in these callings, that we may see them as gifts through which we serve Him, the Church and our fellowmen.

Another thing very important for me during this summer was the **elementary Hebrew class**. The goal is to help me "to have an introductory knowledge and understanding of both the diversity and the Christological coherence of the word of God, remaining mindful of the Lutheran principle that Scripture interprets Scripture." Thank God my quizzes, tests and exams are going very well. May God give us capacity to say: "Light shines on the righteous and joy on the upright in heart. Rejoice in the Lord, you who are righteous, and praise his holy name" (Psalm 97: 11-12).

Once again, **thank you** for all your supports, dear members of Concordia Lutheran, Sarasota. All the different people in my Florida-Georgia District, thank you for all you are doing to help me to become a Lutheran pastor. You all are in my prayers.





Maximize the Moments

Our legacy becomes increasingly important as we age. Although some older adults spend days deciding who will get the family china, others turn in a different direction. They focus on the impact of their **legacy**.

That makes sense. After all, there are more days behind us than ahead. Time

is precious.

Take these **four steps** to maximize the moments:

Prioritize. What matters the most to you?

To transmit Christian virtues to the next generation, prioritize praying for your grandchildren (or the other youngsters God has placed in your life) by name every

day. To ease the transition of your volunteering to a new leader, write a leader's manual. To comfort friends who are grieving, sign-up for an e-card service or buy a box of stationery.

Invest in **what's important**.

Remember the why. Connect the goal to the meaning.

Remind yourself why your legacy matters. This mental process increases the "stickiness." We stay motivated when we reflect on the reason we pray daily for that teenage neighbor or plug away at downsizing. Focus on the core purpose to prevent a wandering mind.

Be realistic. Approach goals in a way that makes sense. As we move through the "Go go, Slow go and No go" seasons of aging, it becomes harder to

meet long term goals. We need more frequent "wins" to keep us engaged. Be realistic by building micro-habits.

Breaking big plans into more **do-able segments** makes it quicker to meet goals. We stay motivated when the starting point and finish line are close together.

Serve. Our legacy will be reflected in those we help. Although it's tempting to feel "been there, done that" when asked to serve, we bring years of experience. We aren't competing anymore; we can celebrate the power of collaboration. We know how to mentor. The legacy of others is now reflected in our own lives. Our influence is magnified when we serve.

"Free and joyous." Many people do not think of stewardship as being free and joyous but it really can be when we have the calm assurance that our God richly provides all that we need for the support and wants of our body and life.

"Child of God." What a beautiful title for God's people! The opening verses of 1 John 3 speak of the lavish love of God resulting in making us His very own children. What great good news and what a powerful reminder of the proper motivation for our stewardship activity – love to our God who first loved us.

'God's family, the church." This phrase reminds us that our stewardship is not a solo

performance but is done within the Christian community to honor God and benefit others.

"In managing all of life and life's resources." Part of our stewardship struggle is that we think we "own" all those things that surround us when, in truth, we are managers. Another part of our struggle is that we may think that Stewardship is just about money, time and talents. Christian stewardship is about those things and more; Christian stewardship involves our whole life--everything that God has entrusted to us to manage as faithful stewards.

"For His purposes." Maturing stewards do the right things for the right reasons. All we do as Christian stewards is to be done to the glory of God and for the welfare of others as well as ourselves.

Who said stewardship was easy? If it were, everyone would be doing it!
