What Is Your Christian Duty?

Table of Duties – Certain passages of Scripture for various holy orders and positions, admonishing them about their duties and responsibilities. (This month our catechism directs us to Bible truths about our **church** relationships. In the next months we hear about our duties in the **state**, then **family**, then workplace.)

To Bishops, Pastors, and Preachers

The overseer must be **above reproach**, the husband of but one wife, temperate, self controlled, respectable, hospitable, able to **teach**, not given to drunkenness, not violent but gentle, not quarrelsome, not a lover of money. He must manage **his own family well** and see that his children obey him with proper respect. 1 Timothy 3:2-4

He must **not be a recent convert**, or he may become conceited and fall under the same judgment as the devil. 1 Timothy 3:6

He must hold firmly to the trustworthy **message** as it has been taught, so that he can encourage others by sound doctrine and refute those who oppose it. Titus 1:9

What the Hearers Owe Their Pastors

The Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel. 1 Corinthians 9:14

Anyone who receives instruction in the Word must **share all good things** with his instructor. Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Galatians 6:6-7



- 4) Lightbulbs 75 watts or less. Please no bulbs for dimmers.
- 5) **Bedding** such as new pillows, new or gently used mattress pads, towels, sheets. Some furniture can be picked up.
- 6) Gift cards from Walmart, Dollar Tree, Target, etc. Or, write a check to "Concordia," writing also "Refugees" on the memo line and your envelope. At times we must buy bed frames.

On Saturday December 11, 2011 I had the privilege to do a book signing for my new book Keep Me and *Keep All* at a Christian Family book store.

Out of all those sales there was one sale that I purposely did not make that stands out in my mind.

A lady and a high school age boy entered the store. As they passed by, I requested an opportunity to explain the two books I had to sell.

After a few minutes of explanation, she turned to her grandson and asked, "Would you read this book if I bought it for you? He responded with shaking his head and answering "Yes." She decided to purchase 2 books for her two grandsons.

In the continuing conversation I found out she attended Grace Lutheran Church where I was to preach the very next day. I decided to tell her she should wait until tomorrow and I would sell them to her there. This way I could reduce the cost for her and receive more profit from the sale.

Sunday morning, I looked for her before church and after church. I couldn't find her. At this point I asked the pastor, "Where's ... I think her name was Joyce?... I am supposed to sell her two of my books." His reply shocked me. "Joyce is the one who I announced had died during the night." It was difficult for

me to grasp what had just taken place in the last 24 hours!

She wanted to leave a legacy. She was living her life in the victory of Christ. She wanted to share her faith with her grandsons. (I gave the books to the pastor to give to them.)

God gives us all another good lesson here. Joyce had been thinking ahead, wanting to provide for her grandsons. Our lives, Joyce's and mine, only crossed once in this lifetime. Yet it was a significant

passing that won't be forgotten by those grandsons and me. I am amazed how God used me to bear fruit in that situation and it was His plan for our lives to touch.

Definition of success in 2024: To be the best Christian witness I can possibly be in the time and place where God has put me to His glory.

Don't wait in sharing your Christian worldview and love with someone you are close to or anyone who crosses your path. This is God's plan for you. You might not be here tomorrow to do it.

Who knows? It could be your final year or your final day to live in God's grace on this earth.

My challenge to you is this: Wholeheartedly ask God about HIS plans, and offer yourself to carry out His purposes. Start today to make a new ending your rest of your life!

VOTERS' ASSEMBLY MEETING MINUTES December 2 and 3, 2023

- **Call to Order:** by Concordia's President, Dennis Jesse at 5:20 p.m. on Saturday and at 10:09 a.m. on Sunday.
- **Prayer for the Lord's guidance and wisdom:** by Pastor Stephen Gaulke on Saturday and Dennis Jesse on Sunday.
- Dennis Jesse announced that Concordia is a "very, very, very healthy church." He further named and thanked all Council members for their service. Additionally, Dennis thanked church members for increasing their donations. He said that he appreciates all the calls he receives from church members. Dennis mentioned that an external audit was completed in March of 2023, and Concordia is in the 95th percentile of all Missouri Synod Lutheran churches. He stated that the narthex remodeling makes that part of the church more appealing. In Sunday's service he thanked Junne Ulbrich for her help in the decorating of the Bob White Welcome Center. Dennis said that the Council approved a "use it or lose it" policy for paid church workers concerning vacation and personal days. He further stated that dedicated funds not earmarked for a specific purpose were combined with general offerings. In Saturday's meeting Dennis said the employee evaluations were instituted this year. They were completed by church elders and council members. 16 responses were received resulting in a 3.7% raise for paid church workers. In Saturday's meeting Dennis said that we have bought workman's comp. insurance, and we are updating the employee handbook. With regard to the skyrocketing costs of wind mitigation insurance, he said we will self-insure rather than renew. We will add protective window coverings for protection.
- **Approval of the December 2022 Voters' Assembly Minutes** (bright yellow handout). On Saturday, Treasurer Tom Mann made a motion to approve 2022's minutes, and Judy Dennis seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. On Sunday, Vice President Phyllis Kirtley made a motion to approve the minutes, and Tina Granthon seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- **Elect 2024 Church Council** (purple ballot). Dennis Jesse asked those in attendance for nominations for the Fellowship chair to be vacated by Barbara Briggs at year end. None were suggested. At Sunday's meeting, Dennis explained the duties and how sub committees are needed for the many duties. At Sunday's meeting he mentioned that there were two candidates for the Vice Presidency: Phyllis Kirtley and Alice Williams. The slate of candidates was approved as presented.
- **Adopt 2024 Financial Plan** (green handout). At Saturday's meeting, Dennis Jesse presented the 2024 financial budget. Tom Mann presented the budget at Sunday's meeting. Both Tom and Dennis said funds that were earning a small rate of return with LCEF (Lutheran Church Extension Fund) were moved to CD at 5/3 Bank at a 4% increased earning rate. On Sunday, Diane Horn reminded the voters that the LCEF supports Lutheran Churches. Dennies replied that some funds were left on deposit there, and also the Foundation deposits their money there.
- **Pastoral Report** (gray handout). Pastor Stephen reported that church attendance has not rebounded to pre pandemic levels. He said that this is not unique to Concordia. He directed those in attendance to the back of the front page which outlined a plan by the district to start several new LCMS churches in growing areas in Florida. A meeting will be held at Concordia on January 22nd from 9 a.m.-2:30 p.m. to help a mission start in our own Suncoast region.
- Annual Report from the Concordia Lutheran Foundation (pale yellow handout). On Saturday, Dennis Jesse said that the Foundation gifted 7 students with \$1,000 each for education expenses. He mentioned that the Foundation is offering a \$4,000 matching grant for seminarian Euder Paul's seminary expenses. Euder will be at Concordia from December 16th to January 1st. He will preach on December 30th and 31st according to Pastor Stephen. On Sunday, Phyllis Kirtley said that the Foundation will have no expenses before year end. She said that it will see several hundred dollars in interest.
- **New Business** Jim Thomas asked for donations to replace the side lighting in the sanctuary. He also said that memorials received in his late wife, Alice's name were used to paint the LCMS cross on the outside of Willer Hall.

Concordia Foundation Report

What is the **Concordia Foundation**? The charity chartered in 1962 "to carry on such exclusively **religious, charitable, and educational work**, and to provide financial assistance... consistent with... Concordia." Incorporated as a legal/financial base for special contributions from Concordia's members and friends, the Foundation had grown to \$72,000 in 1988. Today even after many financial tasks accomplished, the Foundation holds **\$176,921**. All was generously donated by Concordia Sarasota's people past and present.

The Foundation usually aims to give grants that conserve the fund's capital while distributing out the **interest income** only. Over the years, various recipients have included the roofing fund, organ fund, numerous charities, LCMS mission churches, and scholarships for our members attending college and our Lutheran elementary and preschools. All of the fund has long been invested in the Lutheran Church Extension Fund, the "LCMS bank," where the money is always being loaned to finance growing churches.

In **2016** (the first time in more than a decade) the Foundation spent her **capital**. The Foundation **matched the first \$50,000** donated by members of the congregation to Concordia's major repairs and **roofing campaign**. The Foundation also **matched the first \$5,000** donated towards our **Missionary Fund**, that year sending Rev. Dr. Naumann to Sri Lanka.

In **2023** interest monies and gifts blessed **seven college students** (\$1,000 each) with "for books, etc." gifts. The Foundation Board also set a **\$4,000 matching grant** our **St. Louis Seminary** (to help

cover the Sem's \$8,000 semester food/housing/insurance costs) for our student Euder Paul. This grant has now been fully matched: thanks, donors! Because **Seminarian Paul** cannot travel to his wife Judelande in troubled Haiti, and he has not been able to visit us since he left for the seminary (spring 2021), our board decided to bring him to Sarasota to work among us on his **Christmas break** (perhaps **\$500**). (Thanks to the donors who separately provided for our seminarian's Sarasota flight!) Another **\$500** Foundation grant helped purchase a furniture-moving trailer used week after week by **Concordia's volunteers** with our **Refugee Resettlement** (Lutheran Services Florida) ministry.

What would you recommend, helping the Board wisely manage Foundation 2024 grants and blessing the Lord's works?

Current members of **the Foundation Board** are Barbara Briggs (term through 2024), Phyllis Kirtley (2025), Gary Thomas (2026), and Thomas Mann (2027). Each serving a four-year term, Concordia's president appoints one new member annually. All meetings of the Foundation are open to Concordia's people. The Foundation's next meetings are scheduled for 11:30 a.m. Thursdays **January 18**, **July 11** and **November 7**, **2024**, at our Willer Hall.

Many of Concordia's members continue to **advance this partnership**, helping others in Jesus' name. Please continue to support the Concordia Foundation with "over and above" special gifts. Can you make a one-time donation? On-going support answers continuing needs. Have you written the congregation, or Foundation, into **your will**? Thanks!

An Education Fund

The **Bette Schoenherr Fund** was established by our beloved former member with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (our national church body's financial manager). The capital invested there pays to Concordia the annual interest. So far in 2022 \$2,175 of the Schoenherr "income" interest monies came to the **Concordia Foundation**. (See financial report, above.) All these funds assist with tuition or payments for **Christian education**, as Mrs. Schoenherr directed.






