What About Your Government?

Table of Duties – Certain passages of Scripture for various vocations, admonishing us about our duties and responsibilities (continued from last month).

Of Civil Government

Everyone must **submit himself** to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.

Consequently, he who rebels against the authority is rebelling against what **God has instituted**, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves. For rulers hold no terror for those who do right, but for those who do wrong. Do you want to be free from fear of the one in authority?

Then **do what is right** and he will commend you. For he is God's servant to do you good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword for nothing. He is God's servant, an agent of wrath to bring punishment on the wrongdoer. Romans 13:1-4

Of Citizens

Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's. Matt. 22:21

It is necessary to submit to the authorities, not only because of possible punishment but also because of conscience. This is also why you **pay taxes**, for the authorities are God's servants, who give their full time to governing. Give everyone what you owe him: If you owe taxes, pay taxes; if revenue, then revenue; if respect, then respect; if honor, then honor. Romans 13:5-7

I urge, then, first of all, that **requests**, **prayers**, **intercession and thanksgiving** be made for everyone—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good and pleases God our Savior. 1 Timothy 2:1-3

Remind the people to be subject to rules and authorities, to be obedient, to be **ready to do whatever is good**. Titus 3:1

Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. 1 Peter 2:13-14

Valentines - Pastor Bob Smith, Concordia's Winter Hospitality Pastor

Having shopped at Publix, CVS, and other stores in the days following Christmas, I again realize how quickly these places change their emphasis on marketing to the next season to sell various items. The month of February brings Valentines Day.

Have you ever thought where the word Valentine came from? There are a number of historical theories. I have adopted this one: Valentine was a young Christian priest who lived in ancient Rome during the reign of Claudius II. At this time young Roman men were not overly eager to leave home to fight in the emperor's unpopular, and seemingly unceasing wars. According to one story, the emperor placed a ban on marriage for all of Rome's young men. His opinion was, if his men didn't have a love connection to wife and family, they would more readily march away to distant lands.

Valentine felt sorry for the unhappy Christian men and their sweethearts, so he secretly and illegally performed a large number of Christian



marriages. He was put in prison. According to legend, St. Valentine signed a letter "from your Valentine" to his jailer's daughter, whom he had befriended. Eventually Valentine was put to death because of his faith in the Savior on February 14th A. D. 270. He has become known as the patron saint of lovers.

This theory about St. Valentine may not be accurate but we do know the greatest love story. It is God's shocking love for this sinful world. It is so great that He gave His Son so that whoever believes in Him will not perish, but have eternal life.

Love is the essential element that gives meaning to all the other acts of compassion. Without love all those other things, as powerful and as important as they are, lose their meaning. Therefore, love is the measure of all things. If you want to know what love is, look at Jesus, look at His body broken and His blood shed for us. He is the eternal, unconditional self-sacrificial love of God in the flesh! It will motivate us to love others as we are loved. The main evidence of maturity in the Christian life is a growing love for God and for God's people, as well as a love for lost souls.

We want everyone in our family, our friends, or anyone who crosses our path to know the love of Jesus. Witnessing occurs in everyday conversations whenever we tell what Christ has done for us. We need to avoid the trap of making witnessing more complicated than it is. A Christian's duty as a witness is only this: To tell how God has had mercy on you and to leave the results to Him.


A Note from the President

Constitutional Quorum in person

The meeting was called to order by Phyllis Kirtley at 5:59 P.M.

Opening Devotion: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 was read and discussed.

Leadership Report: Pastor Stephen said that Seminarian Euder Paul is being brought to Concordia and will preach the weekend after Christmas.

Pastor Stephen announced that the 10 churches of the LCMS Sarasota district will meet at Concordia on January 22nd to begin planting the next church plant in our circuit.


