This Holy Week

Concordia delights to meet Jesus in worship. Have you with us tasted His presence? **Come!** This week crowns the church year!

Palm Sunday.

Celebrate the Sunday of **Jesus' Passion**, **March 23** Saturday 4:30 p.m., or **March 24** Sunday morn, 9 a.m. (praise band) or 11 a.m. (organ, choir). "**Hosanna** to Jesus, son of King David! The Lord saves!" Jerusalem welcomed her King with a parade, waving palm branches. Jesus marched on, not to a golden throne, but to a splintered cross. Our worship will relive the grand story, told in John 12:12-19 and Mark 14-15. "What **wondrous love** You give, Jesus!"

Maundy Thursday, 7 p.m. March 28.

Jesus washes the disciples' feet, an example of His "**new mandate**" (so the name, "Maundy" Thursday). "A new command I give to you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." (John 13:34)

Then, on this very night before He goes to the cross, He gives us His "**last will and testament**." "This (Passover bread) is My body. This (wine) is My blood, for your forgiveness"

(Matthew 26:26-28, 1 Corinthians 11:23-25). His will? He will have the last laugh against death. He will come to us alive. In this worship hour, He will give to us His victory's prize, true

forgiveness

Jesus then left the Passover feast to pray in Gethsemane's garden, preparing to be stripped of His life. Our worship concludes praying Psalm 22, as the altar guild leaders **strip the altar bare**, preparing for Friday.

Good Friday, March 29 **Noon and 7 p.m.**, the same service midday and in the evening.

in the **evening.** This Friday, "good"? The Innocent goes to the cross, goes through hell, "good"? See death swallowed up in victory! Guilt, death, hell He will nail and bury. "It is **finished!**" (John 19:30)

Good Friday's worship recalls Jesus' seven statements from the cross. We call the hour "Tenebrae," that is "darkness." In the successive extinguishing of candles, see **our Champion** stride into the deepening darkness. This very darkness He will defeat once and for all!

The Resurrection of Our Lord

Easter is celebrated **Saturday** 4:30 p.m. **March 30** and **Sunday** morn **March 31**. Sunday's first worship is **SonRise at 6:30 a.m.**, the second led by our praise band at 9 a.m., and then 11 a.m. with hymns and organ. (The SonRise worship gathers before dawn in the church's courtyard, next to our Willer Fellowship Hall.) You'll be invited to friendly chit-chat, the excited joy, the new love, born this day.

This is **the feast of victory** for our God! Worthy is Christ, the Lamb who was slain. His blood set us free to be people of God! Every Sunday is a "little Easter," celebrating Him. The same Jesus who triumphed this day lives to serve us every day! Join us for worship and, when you are ready to receive Him, the Lord's Supper.

"You come, Jesus, not demanding that we serve You, but promising that **You will serve** us?! In Your own innocent blood, You have paid the ransom price. You set free all the guilty, free from every enemy! And still You come, our

> Living friend, to serve us today! Gather us and love on us in these holy days. Make us to be more like You, so that we may love one another. Let us give Your love to those who have yet to grasp Your touch. Let it be, **sweet God!**"

Table of Duties – Certain passages of Scripture for various holy orders and positions, admonishing them about their duties and responsibilities (continued from last month).

To Workers of All Kinds

Slaves, **obey your earthly masters**^{*} with respect and fear, and with sincerity of heart, just as you would obey Christ. Obey them not only to win their favor when their eye is on you, but like slaves of Christ, doing the will of God from your heart. **Serve**

wholeheartedly, as if you were serving the Lord, not men, because you know that the Lord will reward everyone for whatever good he does, whether he is slave or free. Ephesians 6:5-8

To Employers and Supervisors

Masters, treat your slaves* in the same way. Do not threaten them, since you know that he

who is both their Master and yours is in heaven, and there is **no favoritism** with Him. Ephesians 6:9

To Youth

Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you, clothe yourselves with **humility toward one another**, because, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that He may lift you up in due time. 1 Peter 5:5-6

To Widows

The widow who is really in need and left all alone puts her **hope in God** and continues night and day to pray and to ask God for help. But the widow who lives for pleasure is dead even while she lives. 1 Timothy 5:5-6

To Everyone

The commandments...are summed up in this one rule: **Love your neighbor** as yourself." Romans 13:9

I urge . . . that **requests**, **prayers**, **intercession and thanksgiving** be made for everyone. 1 Timothy 2:1

Let each his lesson learn with care, And all the household **well shall fare**.

*Pastor's note: The Bible always judges as evil one human "owning" another. **We belong to only God**! Christians today still lead the fight to **abolish slavery**. Paul's point here is that even in the most evil work situation (as a slave) we should do good, because **we work for Christ**!

Sanctuary Lighting

I am in prayer for your help with a project that Doug Kresge and I have been looking into. We have Sanctuary lighting at the ceiling that has not worked for over a year now as they cause interference with our sound system. We would like to replace these lights with the latest "LED" technology lights.

To simplify: This project consists of removing the existing gas filled neon lights and transformers which extend **50 feet on each** side, at the ceiling in the artificial balcony of the sanctuary. The lights would then be replaced with RGB+TW Tunable Tape lighting which has the option in **unlimited palette of color** combinations. You also have the ability to adjust true white light ranging from **2700k to 6000k**. This would provide intense color saturation effects for limitless color combination. Colors are red, green, blue, yellow and white.

The cost for this project would be \$10,000. So any donations for this **wish list upgrade** would be appreciated. Quote and **specifications** are with Lei Ann in the church office. Donations towards this expense should state on the memo line of your check "Sanctuary Lighting Fund" and your check should be made payable to "Concordia Lutheran Church.



"This could not have happened to me."

I was running across a road in Calcutta, India and was bumped by someone on my left side. I stumbled into an older woman on my right side. In order to keep my balance, I grabbed her arm and helped her to keep from falling. Finally, when I arrived on the other side, I checked my front pocket for my billfold. It was gone! I quickly gazed around the crowd and said to myself, "This could not have happened to me." Unfortunately, it did happen. All I could think was that whoever did it was a really smooth mover. The person was great at the skill of picking someone's pocket.

This was the third time in my life I had been robbed. Twice my home had been burglarized. Once was when my family and I lived in Fort Wayne, Indiana. The second time was when we lived in Saginaw, Michigan. Each time shock and denial were my first responses.

When evil has been suffered, anger is often a person's



At another point of a loss, I have often tried to bargain with God. "Lord, please help me get my billfold back. If you help me, I'll take better care of it." It is typical for a person to want to make a deal with God. S/he will make promises that may be difficult to keep later. In a health crisis, people will compare the take better life. will sometimes make promises to turn their life to serving Him if their health is returned.

The next stage of grief one often travels through is depression. The reality of what has or is happening is finally and fully perceived. This is when self-pity takes place. I certainly was depressed when I realized my billfold was gone and would probably never be found again. It was not losing the money that hurt, but my credit card, driver license, and pictures that weighed heavily on my heart.

Finally, it came to the stage of acceptance. The loss of my billfold just had to be accepted. It was gone forever.

Let me summarize the theories of Elizabeth Keubler Ross. She is the one who has studied and the stages of grief I just went through for you.

1.Shock and denial 2.Anger and frustration

3.Bargaining 4.Depression 5.Acceptance

Do these stages always happen in this nice neat progression? No, they don't. They may overlap. The question comes after a loss or catastrophe of any kind "Why did God let this happen to me?" God can use events like robberies to mature and strengthen character. There will be in the future bigger challenges or losses that I will face. I was disappointed but not discouraged.

There were twenty-two other participants in the group I led to Calcutta. They watched very closely how I reacted to being robbed. There were positive lessons for us all to learn.

We praised God for not letting it happen to others.

How will you react in the future to a lost or catastrophe of any kind in your life? Others will be watching.

Constitutional Quorum in person

The meeting was called to order by Alice Williams at 6:00 P.M.

- **Opening Devotion:** Philippians 4:4-13 was read and discussed.
- **Leadership Report:** Pastor Stephen highlighted the following from his report: The seasonal worker contract; the invitation to the new church plant meeting; new church members, and that weekend worship attendance is up 14% from last year.
- **President's Report:** Dennis Jesse stated that the financial review needs to be completed in the next several months. Additionally, he plans to remove the trash cans from the property. He continues to search for a new home for our theater organ. He thanked last year's Council members for their service. Pastor Stephen stated that we will be getting a better piano on January 16th. The current piano should be sold or donated to a church in need.
- Vice President's Report: A vote was taken among the Council members for a Fellowship Chair to serve during the 2024-2025 term. Diane Scott received 8 votes and Phyllis Kirtley received one vote.
- **Secretary's Report:** November's minutes were read by Ruth Bogenberger and unanimously approved after a few minor clarifications. Alice Williams made the motion which was seconded by Dennis Jesse.
- **Financial Secretary's Report:** Wayne Ulbrich predicted that total donations for the year ending 12/31/23 could exceed \$400,000. Wayne resigned as Financial Secretary, and was thanked for his service.
- **Treasurer's Report:** Tom Mann had nothing to report as year end figures were not yet available.
- **Worship Report:** Cory Biladeau thanked Alice Williams for her dedication and devotion. He said that the elders are working on scheduling greeters and readers for weekend worship. He also said that announcements will be given at the beginning of each worship service. Additionally, the elders at their January meeting reorganized Pastor Stephen's and Pastor Bob's duties to complement each other's strengths.

A motion was made by Alice Williams to suggest that Dawn assemble a task force to develop a new directory. Ruth Bogenberger seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

Fellowship Report: None was given.

- **Service Report:** Margo Arehart said that the Christmas drive for refugees was successful. In addition to member donations, Thrivent contributed \$750 and \$100 in gift cards were received. Margo reminded the Council that we still need a SURE representative. Additionally, the LWML Easter card making event will occur on Saturday March 16th.
- **Properties Report:** Jim Thomas delivered the properties report for Dave Meadows. Jim, said that the north garage is being cleaned out to make room for refugee items. Jim provided the Council with a quote from Doug Kresge to replace the side lights in the sanctuary. There is a need for donations around \$7,000-\$8,000 to complete this project. It was noted by Dennis Jesse that the hurricane shutters need to be paid for before the proposed lighting.




