Christians of Bethlehem Israel

After our weekend worship on **March 2** (Saturday, 4:30 p.m.) and **March 3** (Sunday, 9 a.m. and 11 a.m.), Concordia welcomes faithful brothers and sisters from the Holy Land. With a ministry moment, your church's entryway will display **hand-carved olivewood** items from Jesus' birth town. Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels, and many other crafts... Purchase beautiful wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter and Christmas gifts. **Handmade by Christian families** from Bethlehem, these artworks are their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christians in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. After years of conflict, pandemic, and now war tourism plummets and other income streams are restricted. Many Christian families had to flee their homeland. Last century **the Christian population** of the Holy Land was 30%. Today it is less than 1%.

A Christian family **from Bethlehem** will tell us the story. Can we help? Let's purchase some carvings they present. All proceeds do support Christian families from Bethlehem.

The Cello Still Sings

Don't miss this story-telling and conversation with cellist and author **Janet Horvath**. Janet is the popular guest presenter at conservatories, bookstores, community centers, and book clubs. Inspiring and stimulating, Janet will even sign copies of her book.


Janet Horvath is a lifelong performing classical musician, soloist, speaker, and writer. The associate principal cello of the Minnesota Orchestra from 1980-2012, Horvath has performed in recital and chamber music throughout the United States, Canada, and Europe, on CBC, BBC, and NPR radio stations, and on PBS television. Her book, **The Cello Still Sings** - A Generational Story of the Holocaust and of the Transformative Power of Music, is named among **2023's 100 best** independently published books (Kirkus Reviews).

An innocent question about music leads to the revelation that the author's father played 200 morale-building concerts in the displaced persons camps of Bavaria after World War II, two of which were with Maestro Leonard Bernstein. It is the clue that leads to unravelling the past. This **true story** is a vivid and fast-pac

ed recounting of the decades of silence and deeply hidden secrets, the consequences of trauma, and the quest for truth through the **spiritual sustenance and power** of music. Her work has been described by reviewers as "lyrical," "gripping," "entertaining," and "a heartfelt story vividly and powerfully told."

This Holy Week

Concordía delights to meet Jesus in worship. Have you with us tasted His presence? Come! This week crowns the church year!

Palm Sunday.

Celebrate the Sunday of **Jesus' Passion**, March 23 Saturday 4:30 p.m., or March 24 Sunday morn, 9 a.m. (praise band) or 11 a.m. (organ, choir). "Hosanna to Jesus, son of King David! The Lord saves!" Jerusalem welcomed her King with a parade, waving palm branches. Jesus marched on, not to a golden throne, but to a splintered cross. Our worship will relive the grand story, told in John 12:12-19 and Matthew 26-27. What wondrous love is this!

Maundy Thursday, 7 p.m. March 28.

Jesus washes the disciples' feet, an example of His "new mandate" (so the name, "Maundy' Thursday). "A new command I give to you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." (John 13:34)

Then, on this very night before He goes to the cross, He gives us His "last will and testament." "This (Passover bread) is My body. This (wine) is My blood, for your forgiveness" (Matthew 26:26-28, 1 Corinthians 11:23-25).

His will? He will have the last laugh against death. He will come to us alive. In this worship hour, He will give to us His victory's prize, true forgiveness!

Jesus then left the Passover feast to pray in Gethsemane's garden, preparing to be stripped of His life. Our worship concludes praying Psalm 22, as the altar guild leaders **strip the altar bare**, preparing for Friday.

Good Friday, March 29 Noon and 7 p.m., the same service **midday** and in

the evening. This Friday, "good"? The Innocent goes to the cross, goes through hell, "good"? See death swallowed up in victory! Guilt, death, hell He will nail and bury. "It is

finished!" (John 19:30) Good Friday's worship recalls Jesus' seven statements from the cross. We call the hour "Tenebrae," that is "darkness." In the successive extinguishing of candles, see our Champion stride into the deepening darkness. This very darkness He will defeat once and for all!

The same Jesus who triumphed this day lives to serve us every day! Join us for worship and, when you are ready to receive Him, the Lord's Supper.

"You come, Jesus, not demanding that we serve You, but promising that You will serve us?! In Your own innocent blood, You have paid the ransom price. You set free all the guilty, free from every enemy! And still You come, our Living friend, to serve us today! Gather us and love on us in these holy days. Make us to be more like You, so that we may love one another. Let us give Your love to those who have yet to grasp Your touch. Let it be, sweet God!

Wives, **submit to your husbands** as to the Lord. Ephesians 5:22

To Parents

Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, **bring them up in** the training and instruction of **the Lord**. Ephesians 6:4

It was in the early 1970's while we were still living in Frankenmuth, Michigan. The guestions did help to stimulate conversations in the Smith family and especially at mealtimes.

As a couple, Alice and I have discovered the importance of developing relationships and cultivating our marriage through questions. Through the vears it has become a standard for the two of us when alone or with guests to ask stimulating guestions for discussions during mealtimes.



Encouraging students to ask guestions has also been important in our classrooms. We believe if a person wants to discover good answers then s/he should learn to ask smart questions. Top

students in a class will have the courage and ability to ask the correct question at the appropriate time.

The best auestions are those that are openended. These take thought and time to



explain. I cannot answer it in only one word. The answers come from my knowledge and experience of living a Christian worldview in response to today's secular, humanistic, relativistic and materialistic world.

Only the Lord knows how someone's questions or answers might inspire. We will leave that up to Him. It has been a joy to be challenged to answer these questions. The questions don't change. But your answers to the same questions may change due to acquired knowledge and experience over the years.

People in general, husbands and wives, and families have far too few opportunities to share their deepest thoughts, how to live and love with one another. All of us starve for more intimacy. We pray questions might bridge some of the gaps. Charles Schultz, the creator of "Snoopy," captures the essence of answering questions in the cartoon above. A bunch of little questions






