Can we "dress up" the Holy Spirit's day? In many churches, worshipers **wear some red** in their clothing. Remember: the Spirit marked


Jesus' friends with tongues like flaming fire?

### Jesus Will Feast with You?!

**Christian Questions** with Their Answers – Prepared by Dr. Martin Luther for those who intend to go to the Sacrament.

After confession and instruction in the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, the pastor may ask, or Christians may **ask themselves** these questions:

- 1. Do you believe that you are a sinner? Yes, I believe it. I am a **sinner**.
- 2. How do you know this? From the **Ten Commandments**, which I have not kept.
- 3. Are you sorry for your sins? Yes, I am **sorry** that I have sinned against God.
- 4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins?

His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal **damnation**. See Romans 6:21, 23.

- 5. Do you hope to be saved? Yes, that is my **hope**.
- 6. In whom then do you trust? In my dear Lord **Jesus Christ**.
- 7. Who is Christ? The Son of God, true **God and man**.
- 8. How many Gods are there? **Only one**, but there are three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?

He died for me and shed **His blood** for me on the cross for the **forgiveness** of sins.

10. Did the Father also die for you?

He did not. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both true God and true man. He died for me and shed his blood for me.

11. How do you know this?

From **the holy Gospel**, from the words instituting the Sacrament, and by His body and blood given me as a pledge in the Sacrament.

12. What are the Words of Institution?

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is **My body**, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in **My blood**, which is shed for you for the **forgiveness** of

Dr. Martin Luther in 1529, the little book is treasured still by the world's 84 million Lutherans for clearly opening the Bible's truth and celebrating the heart of the Christian faith. (The "Christian Questions with Their Answers," designating Luther as the author, first appeared in an edition of the Small Catechism in 1551, five years after Luther died).

### An Urgent Call to Fish

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." (Luke 5:10)

Thank you for the warm welcome and support Alice and I have received at Concordia during the past last six months. It is amazing how many people come from all over the world to worship at Concordia. We praise God for the new relationships we have made here. We hope some of the life lessons we have learned were caught by you as we rubbed shoulders and talked about life.

I love to fish for fish but there is a more critical concern today. It is a CALL or COMMITMENT to

FISH FOR PEOPLE! It is URGENT! Permit me the opportunity to share one more story.

Shortly after the 2004 tsunami in northern Sumatra, Alice and I were given the privilege to accompany a small group to Banda Aceh, Indonesia. This coastal city was the most directly impacted by the tsunami. The trip left us with lifetime impressions of the magnitude of the disaster they suffered.

Following the earthquake, enormous 60-foot waves traveling at an estimated 500 miles an hour hit Banda Aceh. Within a few hours, the tsunami killed over 100,000 people. For two to three miles inland, nearly everything was flattened. Whatever you can imagine in your mind as to the scale of the catastrophe, it was worse. Words, videos, or photographs did not capture the full extent of

damage or do it justice.

Grief was profound, lonely, and overwhelming. We were told of one man who lost his entire family. He said he just didn't know how to grieve because the sadness was so great. His eyes could not shed tears. Also, Alice and I sat and listened to a group of teachers as they explained further details about their stories. One man told us he had over fifty relatives die during the earthquake and tsunami.

The most dramatic and touching story came from Armin, a school security guard. For over 30 minutes he shared his detailed description of his survival. Our small group listened in amazement. Tragically, his wife and two children were suddenly swept away as the wave caught up with them while they tried to outrun it on his motorcycle. He never saw them again. Two hours later he found himself alive, his body covered with cuts, lying on a hillside. We will always remember his final words: "It was good for me to tell my story. This is the first time I have told it. The pain comes out when I share it."

At the time of their death, many of the people did not have a personal relationship with Jesus

Christ. Life can be and is short. Death is certain for everyone. The statistics on death are quite impressive. One out of one people die. How many people die without any hope?

Christians know that God is stronger than every wave of sorrow in this life. He wants to help us through difficult times. There is hope for the future. Through faith in Jesus Christ, in the end there is victory. God can take sorrows and tragedies and

turn them into a positive future.

We don't have all the answers; but we do have an overwhelming conviction that through faith in Jesus Christ as our Savior, we are prepared to face the "tsunamis" in our lives. We can help others to do the same. It is urgent for the members of Concordia congregation to continue a COMMITMENT TO FISH FOR PEOPLE! Listen to Jesus of Nazareth and answer his call to be a fisherman of all people.

We look forward to expanding on this vision

and mission next year.

**University of South** Florida St. Pete, where I will pursue a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science on their Pre-




**Law Track**. My overarching goal is to work in Law within the government, although I am still deciding on the specific path. Throughout my school career, I have been

Sanctuary Lighting

I am in prayer for your help with a project that Doug Kresge and I have been looking into. We have Sanctuary lighting at the ceiling that has not worked for over a year now as they cause interference with our sound system. We would like to replace these lights with the latest "LED" technology lights.

To simplify: This project consists of removing the existing gas filled neon lights and transformers which extend **50 feet on each side**, at the ceiling in the artificial balcony of the sanctuary. The lights would then be replaced with RGB+TW Tunable Tape lighting which has the option in **unlimited palette of color** combinations. You also have the ability to adjust true white light ranging from **2700k to 6000k**. This would provide intense color saturation effects for limitless color combination. Colors are red, green, blue, yellow and white.

The complete cost for this project would be \$10,000. To date, \$3,500 has been contributed. So any donations for this **wish list upgrade** would be appreciated. **Quote and specifications** are with Lei Ann in the church office. **Refuge Team Update** 

Sorry it's been a while since a refuge team update - we have been busy! But first I want to thank Concordia and the Council for their support of this ministry. The **donations** given and the shed provided for storage are a Godsend! A very humble thank you as well for the Good Samaritan recognition. The ministry is certainly a **team effort** and everyone involved is vital to its success.

In February, Sara and I hosted our first ever **get together** at our house for the whole team. It was nice to enjoy each other's company

without lifting and moving stuff! We will need to do it more often.

To do a quick recap of how we were able to share the love of Jesus last year; working through Lutheran Services Florida, we **aided 32 families** by providing **household supplies** and helping to **furnish** their new homes. About 40 donated **bikes** were refurbished and given to refugees, along with helmets and pumps. Seven

baskets of supplies for **newborn babies** were given to families. And 30 baskets of **cleaning** supplies and 30 bags of personal hygiene products were provided. Twenty-three pick ups of furnishings during the last two months of the year greatly helped to make all this happen. **God** 

truly provides.

This year we have helped about seventeen **families** so far. We also continue to refurbish donated bikes and provide to families as needed. Thanks to generous friends, church members, and responses to online ads. An additional **gracious blessing** was the refugee ministry received about \$6,500.00 during the Sarasota **Giving Tuesday** event. God provides for every need and always at the right time!

As I say each time, whatever you can do, you will be blessed in giving your time, talents, or treasures to this much needed outreach ministry. Some of the greatest blessings of helping out are seeing the joy and thankfulness on the faces of family members as they receive these gifts to get them started and settled in a **new life of**

Aphasia: What is it?

Aphasia is a loss of language resulting from stroke or other brain injury. As an adult communication disability, aphasia affects spoken and written language, namely... speaking, writing, reading, and/or understanding others, but without loss of intellect.

### **Seminarian Euder Paul**

We received the following note and photos from **Euder Paul, our Haitian member** this month completing his third-year of graduate studies towards **becoming a pastor.** 

Dear friends of Concordia Lutheran Church, Sarasota,

I am very happy to share with you and all the people in the Florida-Georgia District LCMS news about my life at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. My life on campus is a blessing with my formation here to become a pastor for God's Church and God's people. Without your spiritual and economic supports, I can't do that. I want to thank you for all you are doing for me and for the Church.

In the first half of this Spring semester I took a course called *Religion and Society in America*. This course helps me to understand and examine the mutual influence of religion and society including the politics in America. Cultural contexts differ in their assumptions, values and expectations. I learn to

value the need to examine beliefs and practices in light of the Word of God....

I know you are praying for me and my family because of Haiti's situation.



The political situation in Haiti is very deteriorated.
There are a lot fears across the population because of the insecurity in Port-au-Prince. Once again, thank you for your prayers and your words of encouragement. I know you are praying for my wife

Judelande and other members of the family. During this period of political problems, instability of life in Haiti, my prayers and desires are: "God, I want to delight in You, please give me self-control, peace in my heart and take control of the situation."

Let me share with you this verse from the Bible: "Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart" (Psalm 37: 4).

What is the first thing you think of when you wake up? Some people will think about their projects, others about their work, or about a person dear to them, or about the trials they are going through at the moment. And you? Jesus should be frequently at the forefront of our thoughts. Someone once said that the thing we think about when we wake up says a lot about our priorities.

Is God always at the heart of your thoughts? Do you regularly think about how to

advance the Kingdom of God?

The Bible warns us against idolatry. It tells us "flee from idolatry"! We must love God with all our strength, with all our thoughts, with all our hearts. God must have first place. He must be our priority!

Let us seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and the rest will be given to us above all. Abraham understood this, he was ready to sacrifice Isaac, the child of the promise. Even if it cost him, his desire was to please God, to have a heart entirely his own. And you, are you ready to sacrifice what you love to follow God?

Does God always have first place in your heart? Have you lost your first love? What if today you give

23 he was called to serve with **Our Savior LCMS in Lake Worth**, south of Palm Beach. The year after vicarage, Euder expects to complete his seminary education and receive a call to **pastoral ministry**.

Back in December 2021 our Voters' Meeting redirected \$22,500 out of our **2022** \$25,000 mission gifts to **the St. Louis Seminary**, so covering the seminarian's **campus living costs** for Euder's first year-and-a-half of studies. Since 2022, our congregation budgeted no more funds to the seminary. (Budgeted funds have never been given to the seminarian personally.) The Seminary and the seminarian have found other donors to fund his **tuition** costs. As a Haitian with a US Student Visa, he had no opportunity to take (or pay back) any loans.

In 2023 our **Concordia Sarasota Foundation** contributed an \$8,000 **matching grant**. Euder's Concordia friends generously dedicated special gifts that covered costs for "our" seminarian's **room** and board. Thank you! These sums sufficed to the end of Euder's 2023-24 academic year. The Seminary also enabled Euder to take on some part-time work for his personal expenses.

As the Miami Herald reported: "Because regular visa services remain suspended due to Haiti's ongoing escalation in gang violence, the first available openings aren't **until 2026**." Unless the US Embassy in Haiti can reopen sooner, Euder's wife Judelande will not be able to come to the US. Neither will Euder be able to visit her in Haiti. "Lord, have mercy!"


