What Do You Believe of God?

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the **Holy Spirit**, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The First Article: CREATION

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and **all I have**. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He **defends** me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.

All this He does only out of **fatherly**, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve, and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

The **Apostles' Creed** comes from the first generations of Christians. Like us, they desired a "short and sweet" summary of the faith that the apostles taught, the Good News proclaimed in the Bible. "Apostles" means "sent ones," those who knew Jesus, whom He sent to tell the world His Good News. "Creed" means "We believe."

The explanation following, "What Does This Mean," comes from the "**Small Catechism**." Written by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther in 1529, the little book is treasured still by the world's 84 million Lutherans for clearly opening the Bible's truth and celebrating the heart of the Christian faith. The meeting was called to order by Alice Williams at 6:00 P.M.




