From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The First Article: CREATION

What does this mean? I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them.

He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and **all I have**. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.

He **defends** me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.

All this He does only out of **fatherly**, **divine**

goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve, and obey Him.

This is most certainly true.

The **Apostles' Creed** comes from the first generations of Christians. Like us, they desired a "short and sweet" summary of the faith that the apostles taught, the Good News proclaimed in the Bible. "Apostles" means "sent ones," those who knew Jesus, whom He sent to tell the world His Good News. "Creed" means "We believe.'

The explanation following, "What Does This Mean," comes from the "**Small Catechism**." Written by the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther in 1529 the little book is treasured still by the world's 84 million Lutherans for clearly opening the Bible's truth and celebrating the heart of the Christian faith. wise and significant.

Wisdom is a combination of knowledge, faith (trust) and righteousness (obedience). But how does the word WISDOM lead to purpose, confidence, honor and all the other good things we desire?

Godly wisdom is developed through a lifetime of Godly decisions, Godly reactions, and the application of scriptural principles to daily circumstances. Luther believed that wisdom lies in truth, found in Scripture, which is everlasting.

All eyes are focusing towards the new year. Our hope is 2025 will heal what 2024 has broken in our world. Only when we view Christmas through the eyes of Calvary can we find the hope our souls need. I pray that in 2025, you'll know that God indeed does have a plan for your life. I hope you'll learn how to find wisdom and how to be wise for the rest of your life.

"Father, as we embark upon a new year, remind my heart to leave the old things behind and look ahead to a new year, full of fresh

possibilities. Amen.'

Christian Stewardship Is...

"Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of **the child of God** and God's family, the church, in **managing all** of life and life's resources **for God's purposes**."

The above definition of Christian Stewardship has been used in our church for a few decades. It contains **only 29 words**, but what a mouthful when you consider the application of the various parts of this definition.

"Free and joyous." Many people do not think of stewardship as being free and joyous but it really can be when we have the calm assurance that our God richly provides all that we need for the support and wants of our body and life.

"Child of God." What a beautiful title for God's people! The opening verses of 1 John 3 speak of the lavish love of God resulting in making us His very own children. What great good news and what a powerful reminder of the proper motivation for our stewardship activity – love to our God who first loved us.

"God's family, the church." This phrase reminds us that our stewardship is not a solo performance but is done within the Christian community to honor God and benefit others.

"In managing all of life and life's resources." Part of our stewardship struggle is that we think we "own" all those things that surround us when, in truth, we are managers. Another part of our struggle is that we may think that Stewardship is just about money, time and talents. Christian stewardship is about those things and more; Christian stewardship involves our whole life--everything that God has entrusted to us to manage as faithful stewards.

Maya Angelou wrote "People will forget what you said, people will forget what you did, but people will never forget how you made them feel". This was one of Pat's favorite quotes and she certainly personified this sentiment during her lifetime.


